Visitors get to stroll along the beautifully designed winding wooden plank trail as migratory birds take to the skies and fiddler crabs crawl around freely on the mudflats.

Ecology here breeds diversified organisms of both plants and animals. And just before the sun settles on the horizon, the evening sky is illuminated with picturesque colors as it gradually shifts from a dreamy nuanced orange to an indigo blue with glorious purple tints.

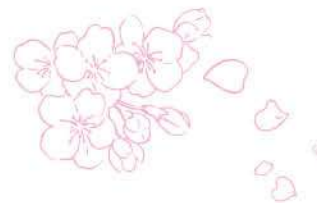
## 7 Fushou Mountain Farm

This stretch of continuous curves is flanked by dense vegetation and tree shade, creating a beautiful scene where the path and branches each make up half of the view, complementing each other perfectly.

## 13 Seaside Bikeway

Starting from Miaoli's Green Light Sea Breeze Bicycle Path in the north, cyclists can travel from Dajia's coastline all the way to Wuri before entering Changhua. The northern end of the bike path, adjacent to the coastline in the Da'an section, offers views of the coastal scenery and wetland ecosystems. Heading south, the path passes through Wuqi Fishing Port and Gaomei Bike Path, where you can feast on seafood and admire the sunset. In recent years, focusing on themes like family inclusivity, culture and history, natural landscapes, and sports and camping, it has become a multi-functional recreational area complete with a sculpture plaza, family park, barbecue area, and hiking trails. The legendary Sword Well is open to the public every Dragon Boat Festival, offering noon-time water as amulets, which is an important folk event in the coastline of Taichung.

## 16 Botanical Garden of the National Museum of Natural Science

Featuring Taiwan's characteristic ecological regions and tropical rainforests, Taichung's little indoor rainforest, as we like to call it, is home to more than 800 species of low-altitude plants native to Taiwan. Discover the extraordinary rainforest greenhouse and its dramatic landscape designs; high-reaching trees, riverine rainforests and rainforest beds. The huge pearlescent swallowtail butterfly installation at the entrance is a landmark known to all Taichung residents. So why not go on a jungle adventure – minutes' walk from the City center.

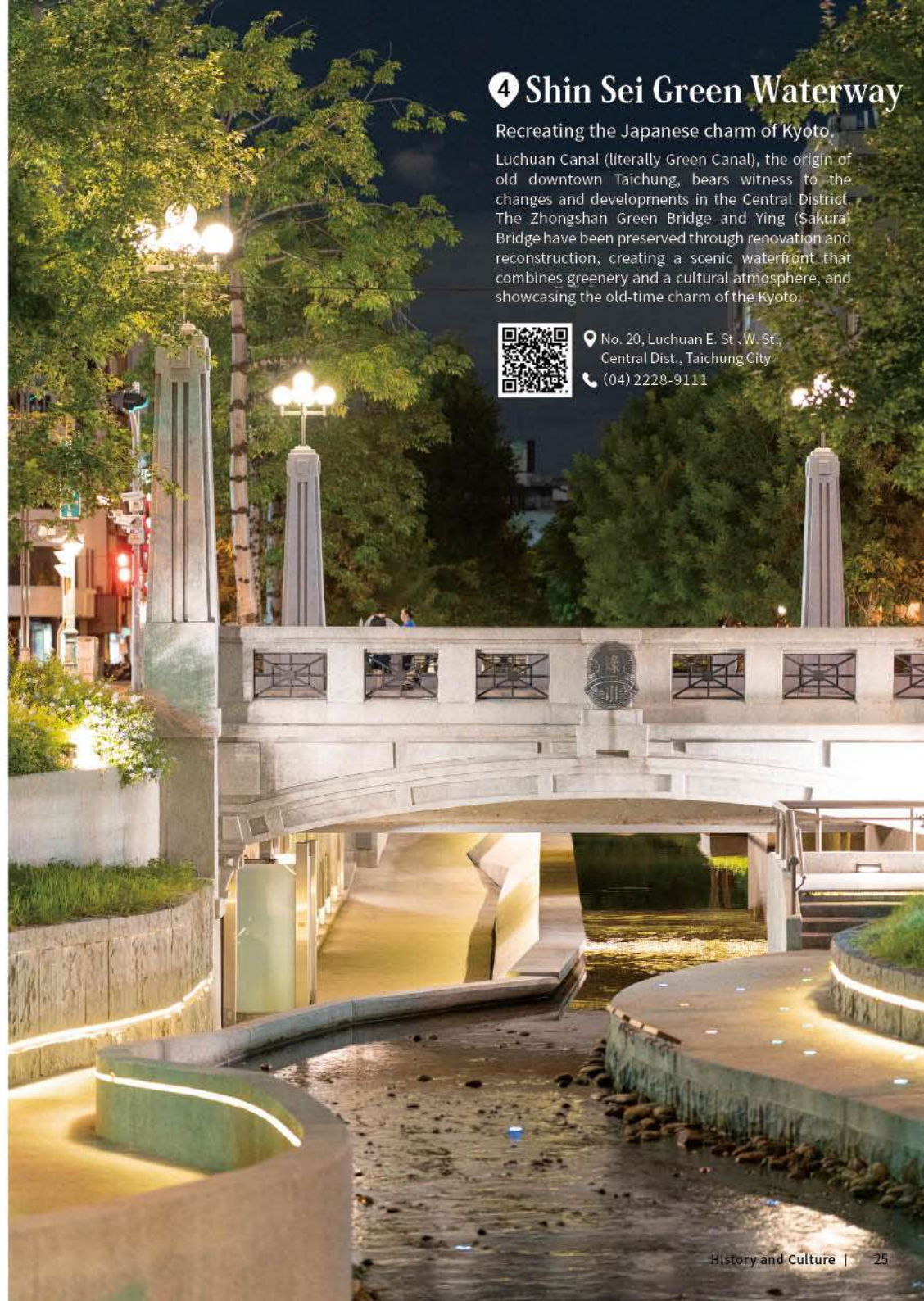
## 4 Shin Sei Green Waterway

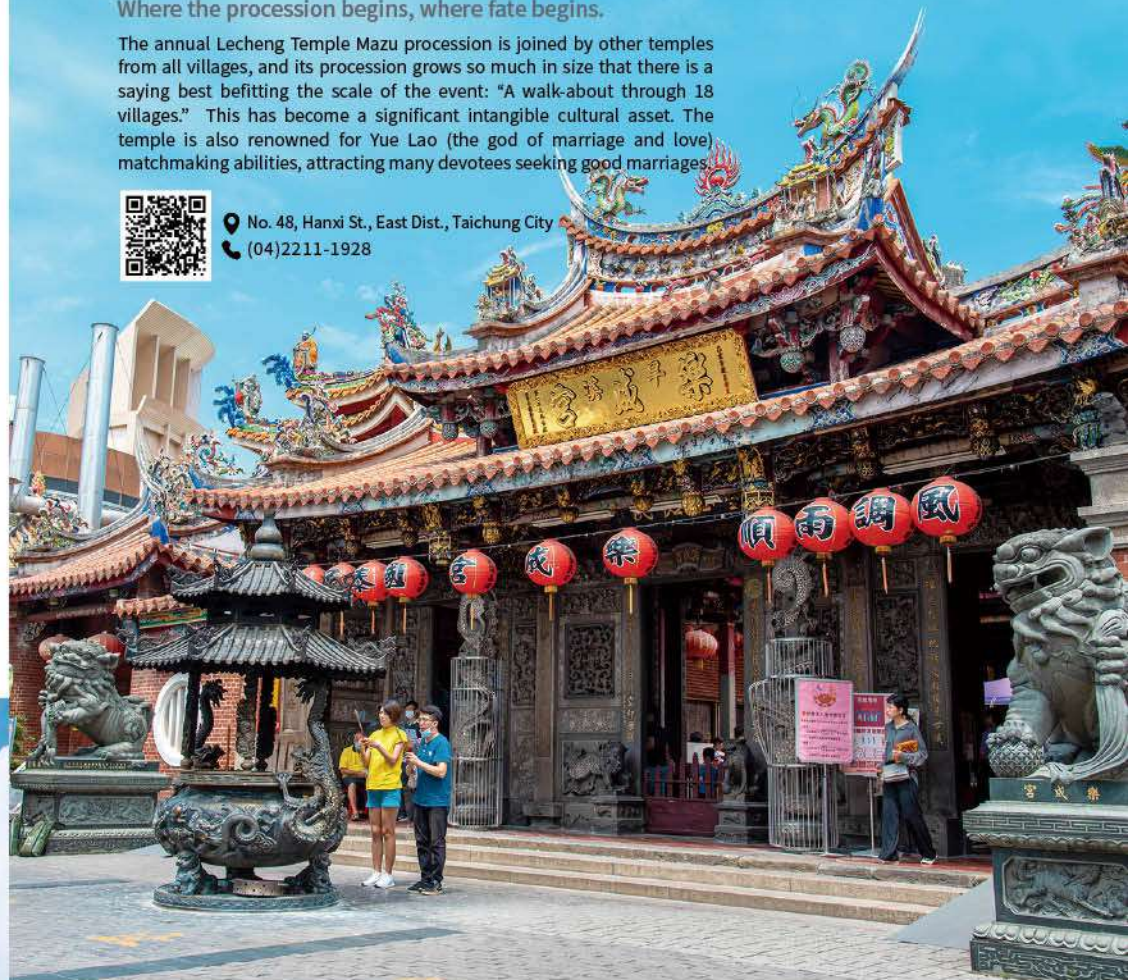
## 19 Lecheng Temple

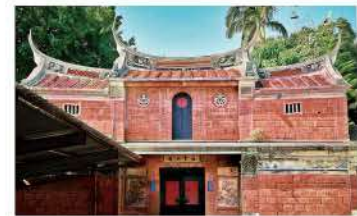

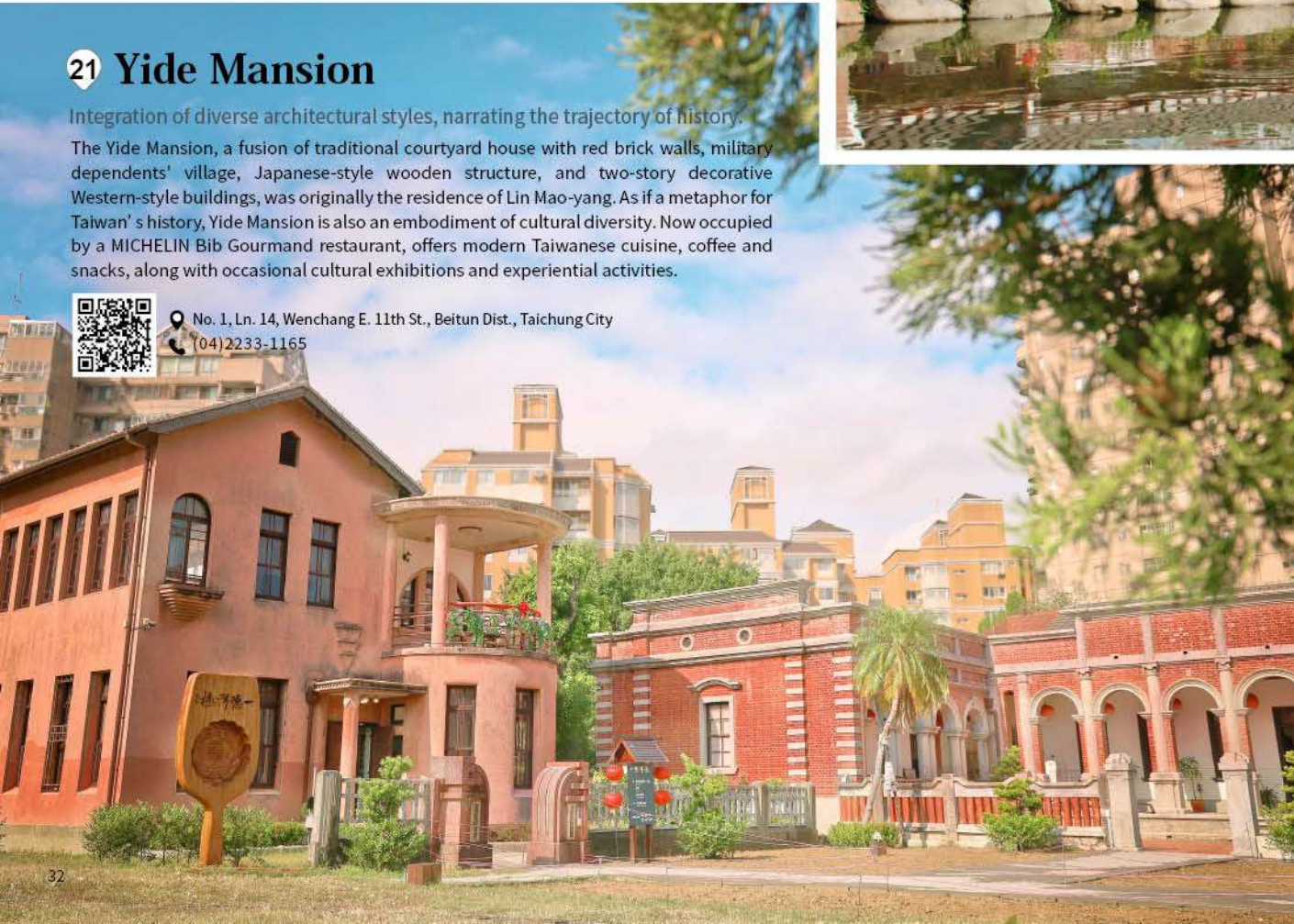
### 21 Yide Mansion

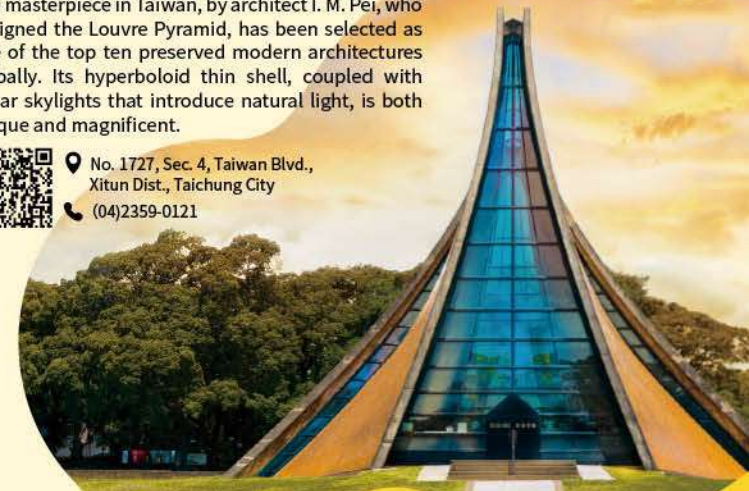
## 31 Luce Memorial Chapel of Tunghai University
