
Riding a bike to appreciate the beauty of the coastline.


One of the world's top ten modern architecture of worthy preservation, located inside the most scenic university campus.



Blending traditional red-brick courtyard houses, military dependents' villages, Japanese wooden homes, and two-story art deco mansions, the former Lin Mao-yang Residence—now known as Yide Mansion—tells the history of Taiwan, where diverse cultures intertwined and flourished. Today, a Michelin-starred restaurant calls it home, offering innovative Taiwanese cuisine alongside coffee and desserts, complemented by occasional art exhibitions and workshops.





Wufeng Lin Family Garden (Gong-Bao-Di)

The first Official Residence in Taiwan during the Qing Dynasty. Introducing Taiwan's Minnan-style architecture
